



- Veteran suicide is a growing crisis and currently 20 veterans per day take their lives in America.
- The Fire Watch program is a coordinated effort between the 5 counties partnered with K-9's For Warriors to develop a plan to put an end to veteran suicide in northeast Florida.
- Northeast Florida has over 125000 veterans. The need, the challenge, and the opportunity is evident.
- All 5 counties Board of County Commissioners have approved the concept of the program.
