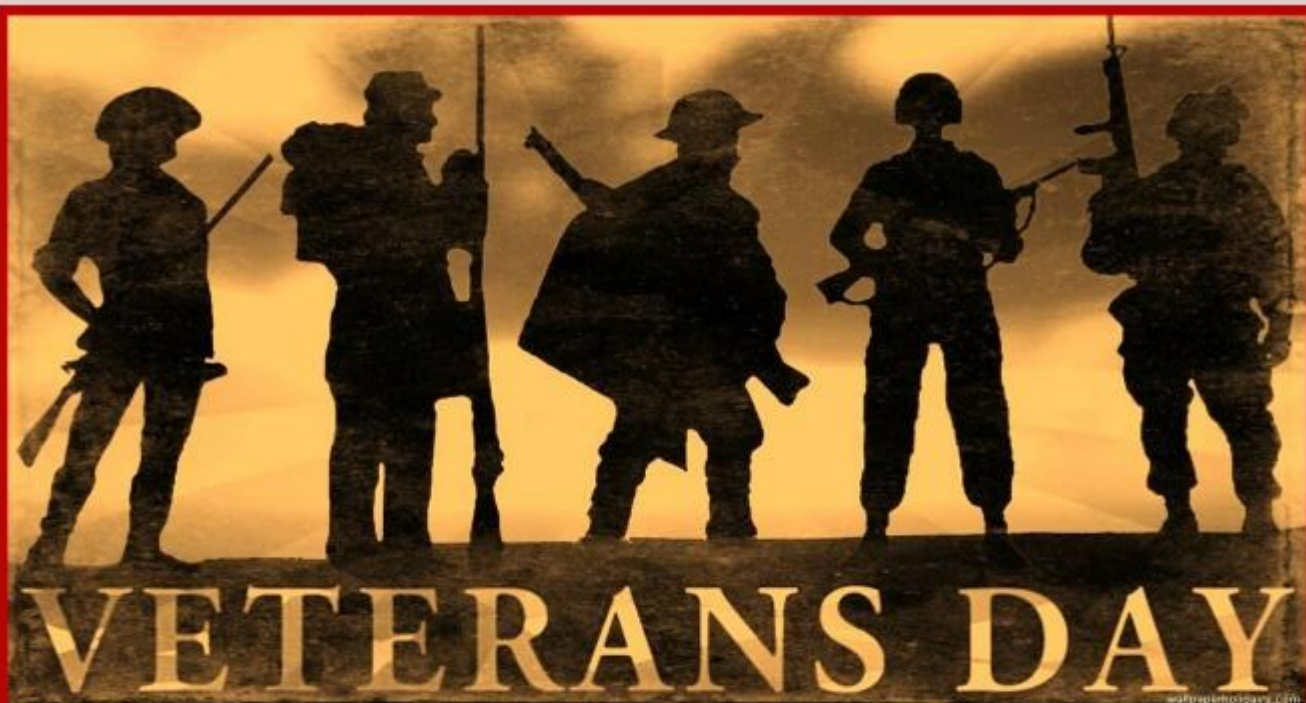

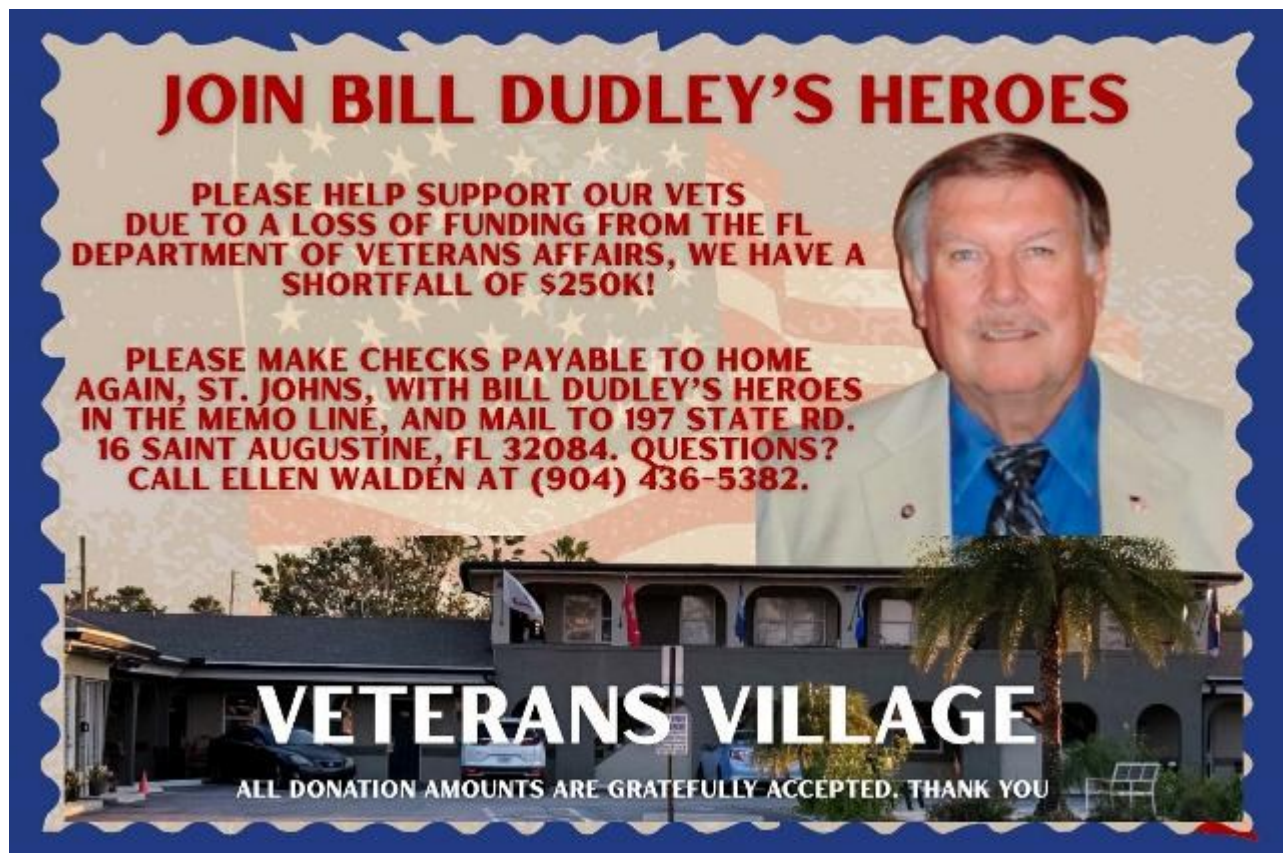

MINUTES OF GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

SEPTEMBER 25, 2025



CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Dudley

WELCOME AND OPENING REMARKS: Chairman Dudley

PLEDGE: Chairman Dudley

INVOCATION

INTRODUCTION OF NEW GUESTS: New attendees introduced themselves and who they represent.

MINUTES OF LAST MEETING: Minutes of last meeting conducted August 28, 2025, were presented by Chairman Dudley. Copies of the Minutes are available on the sign-in table and were sent to members electronically by the Secretary. The minutes were approved by voicevote with no changes.

TREASURER REPORT: As of August 26, 2025, the Council's total liquid cash balance was \$138,723.04; the liquid cash net balance as of September 24, 2025, was \$143,186.27. Treasurer Mountcastle went over the Treasurer's Report regarding money taken in and expenses for the month. The floor was open for any questions. The Treasurer Report was approved by voice vote with no questions or changes.

CHECK PRESENTATIONS: Chairman Dudley accepted a check in the amount of \$1,000 from the St. Augustine Lions Club for Wreaths Across America expenses.

Chairman Dudley also accepted a check, presented by Randy Hudgins from St. Johns Family Funeral Home, in the amount of \$695. The

funds were an overpayment from the VA for an indigent Veteran's funeral expenses.

SPEAKERS:

EDDIE CREAMER, ST. JOHNS COUNTY PROPERTY APPRAISER

Eddie Creamer, the elected St. Johns County Property Appraiser, introduced himself to the group and explained the responsibilities of the Property Appraiser's Office. Mr. Creamer spoke of filing Homestead Exemption in St. Johns County and the exemptions available to Disabled Veterans, Military and First Responders. Mr. Creamer provided a brochure that explains all the exemptions in detail. The floor was open for questions and answers.

JERRY DOMASK, VIETNAM VETERAN, ARTIST, FRIEND OF POW TED GOSTAS Jerry Domask introduced himself and provided a display of his artwork. Mr. Domask spoke of his friendship with POW Ted Gostas, an Army ranking intelligence officer held in captivity for over 5 years during the Vietnam War, and the artwork created to honor him. Mr. Domask spoke of the art created by Mr. Gostas and its national display. The floor was open for questions and answers.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

VETERANS SERVICE OFFICE, MAC MCDERMOTT

Mr. McDermott gave an update on the VSO and the appeals process for claims filed. He gave an account of the number of claims filed and the time taken to review and approve or deny the claims. Mr. McDermott also spoke about staff changes within the VSO and hopes to get a new Service Officer in place soon to help provide relieve the workload within the office. Floor was open for questions.

VETERANS TREATMENT COURT, JOHN LESLIE

John Leslie was not in attendance at this month's meeting due to a fall taken recently by him.

Chairman Dudley spoke of the Annual VTC Alumni picnic that will be held at Heritage Park on Saturday, September 27, 2025, beginning at 11:00 am. All interested are invited to attend.

UNFINISHED/NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Dudley gave an update on the SR16 facility with Home Again St. Johns; we are fully in the facility and feeding people during the daytime. We have not started putting people into units yet but should as of the middle of October. Two units are specifically for homeless Veterans.

Veterans Village has 19 Veterans housed there now, with two more rooms under renovation and will be available soon. There is a waiting list of Veterans to get in.

The Veterans Day Program, hosted by the Veterans Council, is planned for November 11, 2025, at Anastasia Baptist Church. This year's theme will be "Passing the Torch." Everyone is invited to attend.

The floor was open for further questions and new business.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 pm.

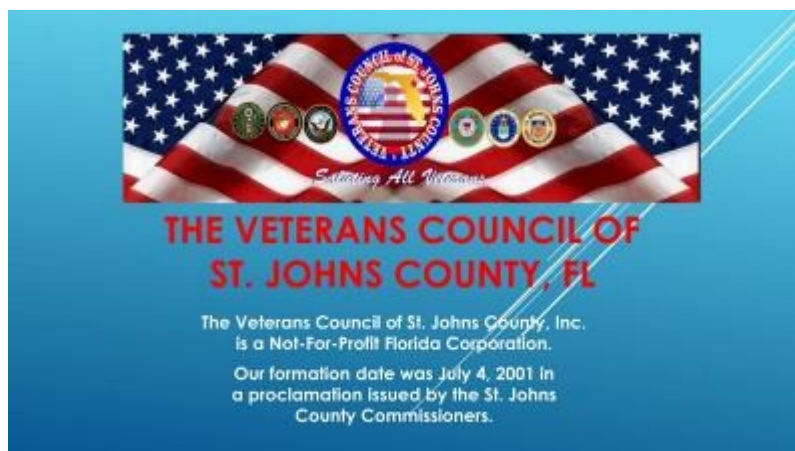

Florida native shot down 81 years ago in WWII to be buried in St. Augustine

Florida native Ralph Cornelius DuPont, who died in aerial combat over Formosa on Oct. 12, 1944, was buried with full military honors in St. Augustine on Oct. 12.

DuPont was a lieutenant junior grade at the time of his death. His burial took place at Pellicer Creek Cemetery, in St. Augustine, at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 12.

According to reports, the U.S. Navy, Third Fleet, Task Force 38, launched a series of massive air attacks between Oct. 12-14, 1944, on Japanese naval targets and air bases on the islands of Formosa and the Pescadores islands — in present-day Taiwan Strait. Dubbed “The Battle of Formosa,” the attacks crippled Japanese naval airpower, paving the way for the upcoming invasion of Leyte Gulf, in the Philippines. DuPont, an F6F-5 Hellcat pilot, was assigned to Fighting Squadron (VF) 18 aboard the USS Intrepid (CV 11). His squadron was part of a task force responsible for attacking targets in northern Formosa.

At 6:17 a.m. on Oct. 12, the aircraft piloted by DuPont launched from Intrepid on a fighter mission over Shinchiku and Matsuyama Airfields. They were joined by 16 Hellcats from VF 8 stationed aboard USS Bunker Hill (CV 17), and four Hellcats from VF 7 stationed aboard USS Hancock (CV 19). The group’s first target was Shinchiku Airfield.

The VF 18 Hellcats dropped their bombs on hangars and maintenance facilities, while the VF 7 and VF 8 fighters provided cover, shooting down six enemy fighters. The group reformed and proceeded northward toward the second objective, Matsuyama Airfield.

En route to Matsuyama Airfield, the group encountered Japanese bombers near Taien Airfield, Formosa (near present-day Taoyuan Airport, Taoyuan, Taiwan), and pursued them through the gathering cloud cover. Suddenly, about 40 Japanese Mitsubishi A6M fighters (nicknamed “Zeros”) descended from the clouds to attack the group.

Taken by surprise, the VF 18 squadron broke apart into a chaotic dogfight, just south and over Taien Airfield, at altitudes from 10,000 feet down to the treetops. The pilots later commented on the “beautiful way the [Japanese] flew their planes,” and observed that they would “pass out of the clouds at Hellcats near the top of the melee and zoom back into the clouds.” The VF 18 pilots

found the safest tactic was to stay in the center of the melee, and to join up in an attack whenever possible. “Time after time,” the squadron reported, “F6Fs with Zeros on their tails led their pursuers in front of other F6Fs who promptly shot the Zeros off.”



The pilots shot down so many Japanese aircraft that they observed three to five parachutes at a time. After more than 30 minutes of fighting, Intrepid’s fighters claimed 19 Zeros with one more “probable” and two damaged.

Navy records state that three VF 18 pilots disappeared during the melee over Taien Airfield, including DuPont and his wingman, Lt (j.g.) Isaac Keels. Thirteen pilots saw several F6F planes crash, and one or two pilots bail out but, as all were engaged in combat, no one was able to identify the planes or pilots.

The reports further record that DuPont and Keels jointly shot down a Japanese Zero before disappearing. After this engagement, neither pilot was seen again. After the squadron returned to Intrepid, DuPont was listed as Missing in Action (MIA) due to unknown causes during combat. Following the close of hostilities, U.S. forces searched for DuPont’s remains without success, and his remains were ultimately deemed non-recoverable.

On April 2, 1946, the American Graves Registration Service (AGRS) recovered a set of unidentified remains (designated as X-248) about three miles west of Taien Airfield. A local policeman testified that he discovered the remains, washed ashore, at Kaiken, three miles west of Taien Airfield, on the afternoon of Oct. 14, 1944. The AGRS believed the remains were likely those of a Navy Airman lost on or before that date, but were unable to identify them.

In 1951, the AGRS transferred X-248 to the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific (NMCP) in Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, where the remains were buried as a World War II Unknown.

In 2023, DuPont’s family shared their research with the DPAA on the possible correlation between X-248 and Ralph, prompting the present investigation. After the Department of Defense approved DPAA’s recommendation to disinter the remains, agency personnel exhumed X-248 from the NMCP on April 6, 2025 and submitted it to the laboratory.

Based on the totality of historical evidence, the Indo-Pacific Directorate supports the association of DuPont with Unknown X-248.

DuPont was a decorated veteran who had received the Purple Heart Medal, Combat Action Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal, American Defense Service Medal (with Fleet Clasp), Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal (with Bronze Star), World War II Victory Medal, and American Campaign Medal.

Modern day

The internment at Pellicer Creek Cemetery was special. All funerals are , each a somber event as we lay a loved one or friend in the ground and say our goodbyes.

But when a hero and loved one that has been missing for over 80 years is finally returned, it is almost surreal. It is like closing the last chapter of a long book, but being happy that it ended the right way.

I have been to way too many military funerals and family funerals in my life. In each, stories are told, memories are shared and honor is given. But this was different. This one has been an unknown date and then suddenly, it happens decades later.

LtJg Dupont was one of four shot down during the Battle of Formosa, where the American Navy planes were outnumbered 4:1. Most people don't remember this battle, but it set the stage for the next battles in the Philippines and Leyte. These helped give superiority over the Pacific during WWII, and eventual victory over Japan.

Although Ralph Dupont was born in Daytona, his tie to us is through Cornelius Dupont being his Grandfather. Cornelius helped establish Matanzas in the 1800s.

The amazing part is that LtJg Dupont was finally laid in his native soil exactly (to the day) 81 years after being shot down. If that isn't fitting, I don't know what is.

Of the 16 million Americans who fought in WWII, less than 70,000 are still alive, with that number decreasing rapidly. These are members of the Greatest Generation, the ones who saw everything from WW1 to the Great Depression through everything we have now.

The preacher made a good statement during the service- a person dies twice in their lives, once when the body dies, once when we forget the memory of the person.

I, KRHD and FCHS are honored that we could be there to welcome you home. Your earthly body may be gone, but you will live forever in our memories.

As you may be aware, funding for some government agencies, including portions of the Department of Veterans Affairs, expired at midnight this morning.

President Trump opposes a lapse in appropriations, and on September 19, the House of Representatives passed, with the Trump Administration's support, a clean continuing resolution to fund the government through November 21. Unfortunately, Democrats are blocking this Continuing Resolution in the U.S. Senate due to unrelated policy demands.

During the current lapse in funding, the vast majority of VA benefits and services will continue uninterrupted, but the government shutdown is not without consequences to VA. Here is what you need to know:

The following critical Veterans care and assistance programs will be impacted by the government shutdown:

VA will not provide Veteran career counseling or transition assistance program activities.

The GI Bill Hotline will be closed.

VA regional benefits offices will be closed.

VA will cease public affairs and outreach to Veterans.

VA will not permanently place headstones or maintain the grounds at VA national cemeteries.

VA will not process applications for pre-need burials.

VA will not print new presidential memorial certificates.

Thankfully, the government shutdown will not impact the following VA services:

Veteran health care is not impacted. VA Medical Centers, Outpatient Clinics, and Vet Centers will be open.

VA benefits will continue to be processed and delivered, including compensation, pension, education, and housing benefits.

Burials will continue at VA national cemeteries. Applications for headstones, markers, and burial benefits processing will continue.

The Board of Veterans' Appeals will continue decisions on Veterans' cases.

VA Contact Centers (1-800-MyVA411) and the Veterans Crisis Line (Dial 988, Press 1) are open 24/7.

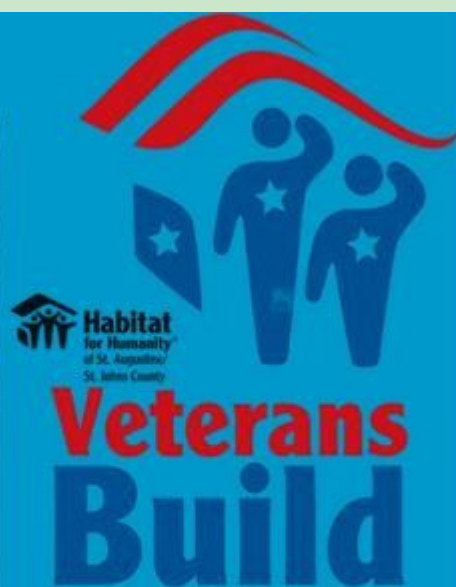

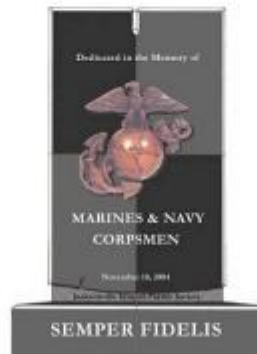

VA gives veterans a year of uninterrupted private health care for 30 different medical specialties By LINDA F. HERSEY STARS AND STRIPES •

August 5, 2025 Veterans will now be able to receive a year of uninterrupted specialty health care outside the Department of Veterans Affairs network without seeking re-authorization, the agency announced. Veterans previously had to get a new referral every three to six months. (Stars and Stripes) WASHINGTON — From cardiology and eye care to addiction treatment and mental health counseling, 30 different types of private medical services will be available to veterans for up to a year without interruption under a new policy announced by the Department of Veterans Affairs. Veterans previously had to obtain a new referral from their VA doctor every 90 to 180 days to continue receiving many specialty health services at “VA expense,” the agency said. “This change means better continuity of care, which leads to better health outcomes,”

VA Secretary Doug Collins said Monday. The policy change is effective immediately. When veterans cannot get timely medical appointments at VA clinics or hospitals, they are referred to vendors, which are private doctors in the community. But expanding the length of time that non-VA care is delivered to veterans is controversial. Opponents of expanding non-VA health care argue the money that the VA spends on private care takes resources away from the agency’s extensive medical care system.

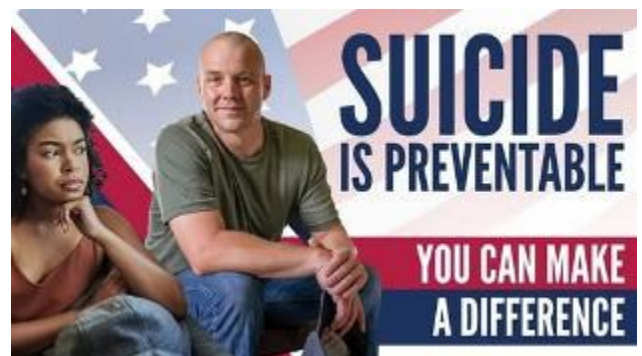
The National Association of Veterans Affairs Physicians and Dentists has stated the increase of community-based medical care for veterans should not detract from VA operations. The organization has urged Congress to continue investing in VA infrastructure and services. “The goal should always be to provide timely, high-quality care without undermining VA services,” according to the association. But the VA expects to reduce its workforce by 30,000 in fiscal 2025, which ends Sept. 30, as part of President Donald Trump’s order to downsize the federal government. Decreases in the VA workforce will be through attrition, a hiring freeze and deferred resignations, the VA said. The agency has pledged to maintain staffing for essential clinical positions and not cut front-line workers. The Mission Act, enacted in 2019, authorized veterans for the first time to seek non-VA health care from private providers. But mandates for frequent reauthorizations can delay and interrupt the delivery of health care, Collins said. By extending authorizations to 12 months, doctors and other health care providers can focus more on treating veterans than on clearing administrative hurdles to continue care, he said. Having uninterrupted care also adds convenience for veterans seeking specialty medical services outside the VA, the

agency said.

The VA is advising veterans to check in with their local VA medical center community care office to find out how their care might be affected by the change. Veterans will not have to seek new referrals for 12 months after an initial authorization on the following health care services: Cardiology, dermatology, endocrinology, neurology and otology, otolaryngology or ENT, gastroenterology, urogynecology, addiction psychiatry outpatient, family and couples psychotherapy outpatient, mental health outpatient, nephrology, neurology, nutrition intervention services, oncology and hematology, neuro-ophthalmology, oculoplastic, eye care examination, optometry routine, orthopedic hand, orthopedic general, orthopedic spine, pain management, podiatry, podiatry DS, addiction medicine outpatient, pulmonary, physical medicine and rehabilitation (physiatry), rheumatology, sleep medicine and urology. PLANNING AND SCHEDULING A BURIAL AT A VA NATIONAL CEMETERY

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) National Cemetery Administration (NCA) ensures those who served this nation are never forgotten. VA operates more than 155 national cemeteries and maintains more than 4 million graves to honor their service and sacrifice. Burial services at VA national cemeteries are provided at no cost to eligible Veterans, their spouses, and qualifying family members.

If you've lost a loved one and need to plan a burial at a VA national cemetery, we are here to guide you through the process. In many cases, we can schedule the burial with a single phone call.

1. **Gather Information and Documents:** Collect personal information identifying the deceased* and military documents showing the Veteran's qualifying service. If the Veteran's discharge documents are not readily available, do not delay calling the Scheduling Office; VA will get copies of them.
2. **Decide on Burial Details:** Determine the cemetery location, type of burial, and whether you will be requesting military funeral honors. If you are using a funeral home, your funeral director will assist.
3. **Contact the National Cemetery Administration:** Contact the National Cemetery Scheduling Office to schedule a burial. If you have a pre-need decision letter, VA will already have much of the required information.

*A death certificate is not usually required but may be in some cases. A representative will explain if needed.

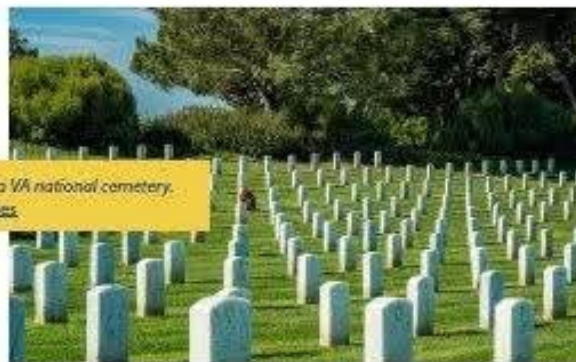

Does the VA pay for cremation or burial expenses?

The VA does not pay for cremation directly. Any item or service obtained from a funeral home will be at the families' expense. Some Veterans' families may be entitled to a burial allowance

Can I be buried in a National Cemetery if I'm cremated?

Yes, either in ground or above ground placement is available, depending on the cemetery.

Can my spouse be buried with me in a VA National Cemetery?

Yes. However spousal benefits do not apply if the Veteran is buried in a private cemetery.

How to report a Veteran's death to VA

The passing of a Veteran is a solemn time that deserves to be recognized and reported with the utmost respect. Veterans have served their country and worked hard for their well-deserved benefits.

However, after a Veteran passes away, family members should report the death of the Veteran to VA as soon as possible to stop current benefits payments. If the death is not reported promptly, survivors or executors of the Veteran's estate may have to repay any overpayments received. Payments the deceased Veteran received may include compensation, pension, education or Veteran Readiness & Employment benefits.

VA encourages loved ones of deceased Veterans to follow the guidance below on reporting Veteran deaths to avoid falling victim to benefit scams.

How to report the death of a Veteran

Calling is the fastest way to report a Veteran's death so VA will stop benefit payments, but there are other options available for reporting.

Options for reporting:

By Phone: Call VA 800-827-1000 (TTY: 711) and select 5. Agents are available Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. ET.

In Person: Go to a VA regional office. Find the nearest VA regional office.

By Mail: Department of Veterans Affairs Claims Intake Center, PO Box 4444, Janesville, WI 53547-4444. Include your relationship to the Veteran and any supporting documents that can help us verify the Veteran's identity. Examples of supporting documents are:

Death certificate or other public record of the Veteran's death

Discharge document (like a DD214)

If you report in person at a VA regional office or by mail, provide copies of:

Death certificate or other public record of the Veteran's death.

Discharge document (like a DD214).

Provide as much information about the Veteran as you can when you first report the notice of death to VA. This information will help VA verify the Veteran's identity. This information includes:

Full name.

Social Security Number or VA claim number.

Date of birth.

Date of death.

Branch of service.

Best practices to avoid survivor benefit scams

Save important files, such as the Veteran's military service/treatment records, discharge papers and copies of their VA claims.

Go to the VA website. For guidance on creating an account and obtaining a VA security Personal Identification Number (PIN) to securely access benefit information. A VA Security PIN is an additional way to secure direct deposit accounts from theft and protect Personally Identifiable Information (PII).

Never give out PII via text, and be cautious of suspicious hyperlinks or unfamiliar hyperlinks.

If a survivor is missing a VA benefits payment, identifies a discrepancy in payments, or find suspicious activity with a direct deposit account, contact VA immediately at 800-827-1000.

Review all documents thoroughly. Survivors should never sign a blank form for some

one else to complete later. They should always review the completed form before signing and retain a copy of the completed form for their records.

For protection against identity theft scams, notify the major credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian and TransUnion) to update the individual's credit report with a deceased notice and notify the Veteran's financial institutions so all accounts can be closed or transferred appropriately.

According to AARP, scammers also use names published in obituaries to pretend to be long lost relatives of the deceased. When it's time to write your loved one's obituary, consider leaving out the birthdate, middle name, home address, birthplace and mother's maiden name.

For other scams predators use, visit www.VA.GOV/VSAFE.

VA is committed to delivering world-class care and benefits to Veterans and their dependents by providing survivors with ongoing support and assistance. Check to see if you qualify for survivor benefits, such as health care coverage, Survivors' and Dependents' Education Assistance Program, housing assistance, or even help with burial costs.

For more guidance on how to report the death of a Veteran, submitting necessary documentation and finding additional resources available, visit VA Benefits For Spouses, Dependents, Survivors, And Family Caregivers | Veterans Affairs.

To report a missing VA benefits payment, identify a discrepancy in payments, or find suspicious activity with a direct deposit account, contact VA immediately at 800-827-1000. You may also file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission if funeral homes charge to set up funeral honors or schedule a burial with VA's National Cemetery Administration by visiting reportfraud.ftc.gov. For other scams predators use, visit va.gov/vsafe.

Burials and Memorials

VA honors the service and sacrifice of Veterans and their family members.

How to Apply

To find out in advance if a Veteran or family member is eligible for burial in a VA national cemetery, click “Apply for Pre-Need Burial Eligibility” to fill out and submit the application.

Apply for Pre-Need Burial Eligibility

If pre-need eligibility has not been determined, upon the death of the Veteran or his or her spouse or dependent (also called the time of need), family members should locate the Veteran’s DD-214 or other discharge papers if readily available and click “Schedule a Burial” to begin the process. Then make arrangements with a funeral home, National Cemetery Scheduling Office, or directly with a VA national cemetery.

VA Memorial Benefits

VA takes special care to pay lasting tribute to the memory of Veterans who served and sacrificed and that of their families. VA meticulously maintains 155 VA national cemeteries in 44 states and Puerto Rico and is working to increase access to accommodate Veterans and eligible family members close to home. Currently, more than 94 percent of Veterans have a burial option in an open VA, state or tribal veterans cemetery located within 75 miles of their home.

Note that most if not all of these benefits may be provided for Veterans who are interred in a State, Territorial or Tribal Veterans cemetery. Check with the cemetery to ensure coverage. Some benefits are also available for Veterans who choose burial in a private cemetery.

Veterans with a qualifying discharge are entitled to VA burial benefits. Spouses and dependent children are eligible too, even if they predecease the Veteran.

The following burial benefits may be provided:

Burial in a VA national cemetery

Opening and closing of the grave for burial of casketed or cremated remains, or placement of cremated remains in an above-ground vault, also called a columbarium

A government furnished grave liner

Perpetual care of the gravesite

A headstone or marker with an inscription

A burial flag

A Presidential Memorial Certificate

A dedicated memorial page on the Veterans Legacy Memorial site where friends and family can upload photos and remembrances

Burial in a private cemetery

A government headstone, marker, or medallion

A burial flag

A Presidential Memorial Certificate

Some survivors may also be entitled to VA burial allowances as partial reimbursement for the costs of funerals and burials for eligible Veterans

Please note that gravesites in a VA national cemetery cannot be reserved in advance. To prepare for a private cemetery burial, VA suggests families review these questions and complete required forms in advance.
